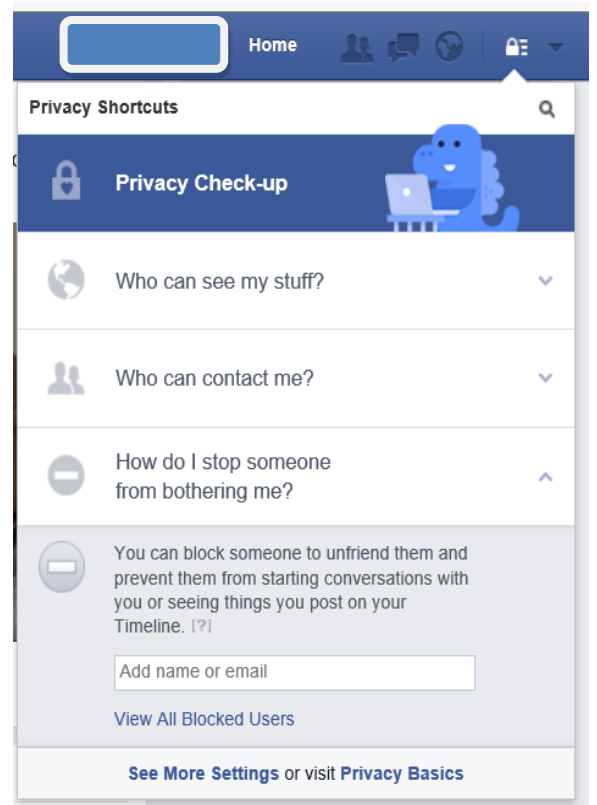
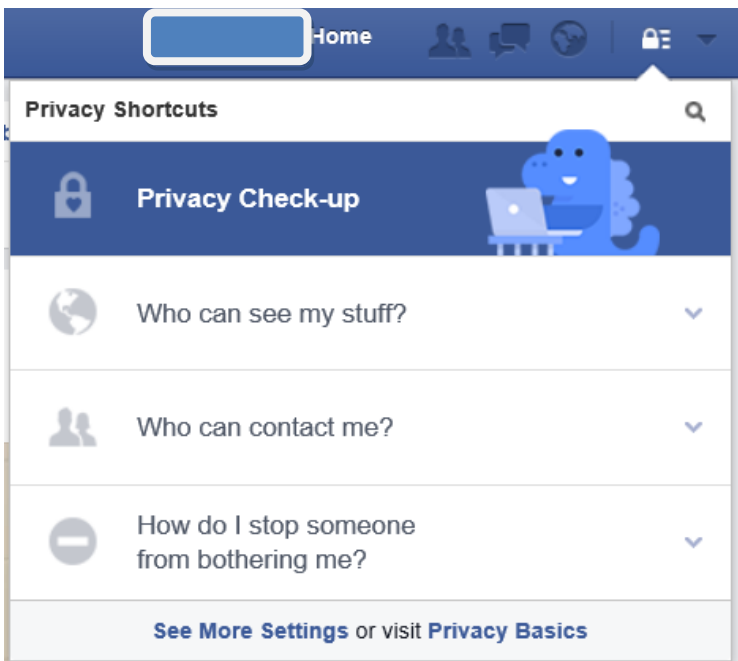


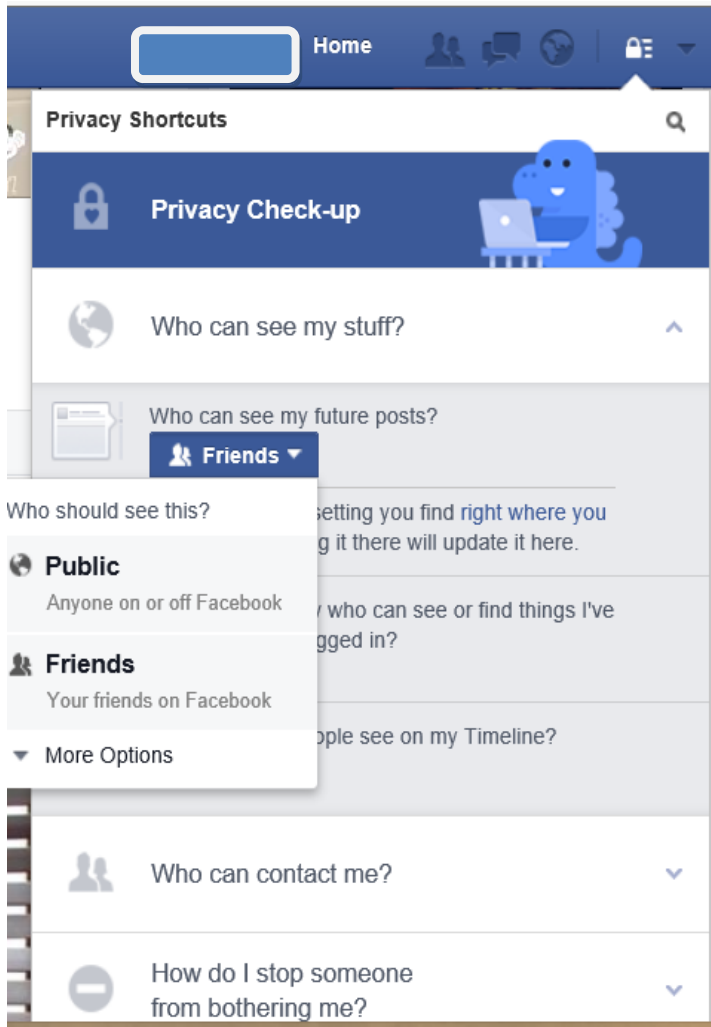

YouTube YouTube is a place to watch, create and share videos. Videos include things like music, animation, online blogs and TV clips.	Instagram Instagram is a picture and video sharing app. Users can post content and use hashtags to share with others.	Facebook Facebook is a social network, which lets you create a page about yourself.	Snapchat Snapchat is an app that lets you send a photo or short video to your friends.	Twitter Twitter is a social network messaging service that lets you send public messages called tweets.

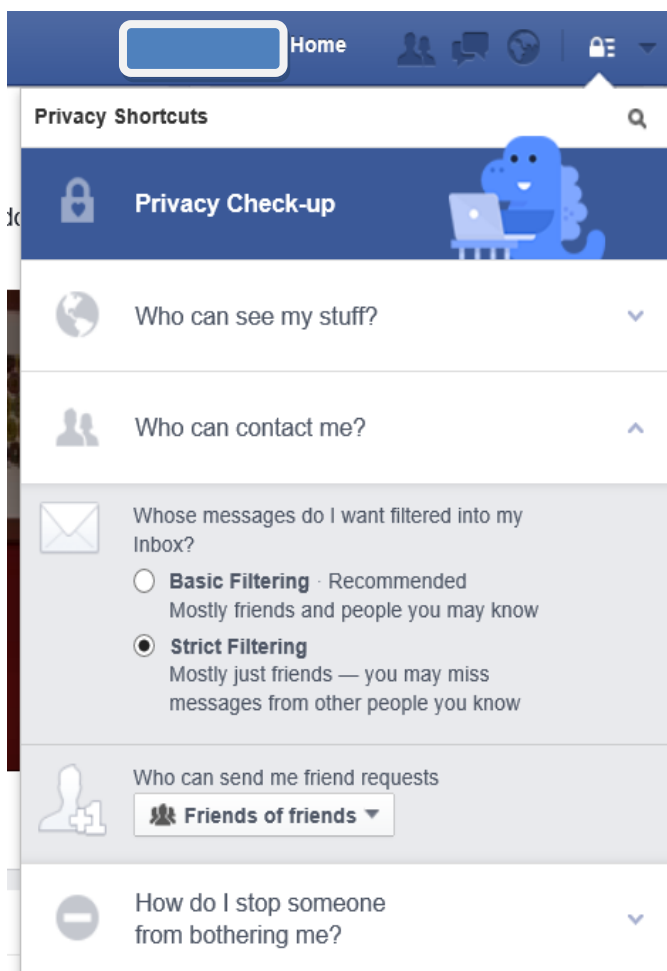


Find the privacy settings in the top right hand corner of the screen once you have logged in.

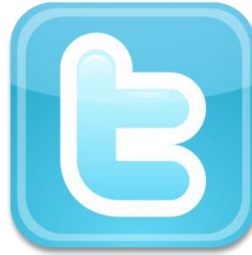


Set privacy to Friends.

Make sure that your child only accepts friend requests from people they know.




Strict filtering prevents your child from receiving any unwanted messages from people they do not know or wish to receive messages from.



Who can see my Tweets?

- **Public Tweets** (the default setting) are visible to anyone, whether or not they have a Twitter account.
- **Protected Tweets** may only be visible to your approved Twitter followers.

Only confirmed followers have access to @This_Is_An_Acct's Tweets and complete profile. Click the "Follow" button to send a follow request.

Note: If you at one time had public Tweets, those Tweets will no longer be public or appear in public Twitter Search results; your Tweets will only be viewable and searchable for yourself and your approved followers. Unprotecting your Tweets will cause any previously protected Tweets to be made public.

Why would I protect my Tweets?

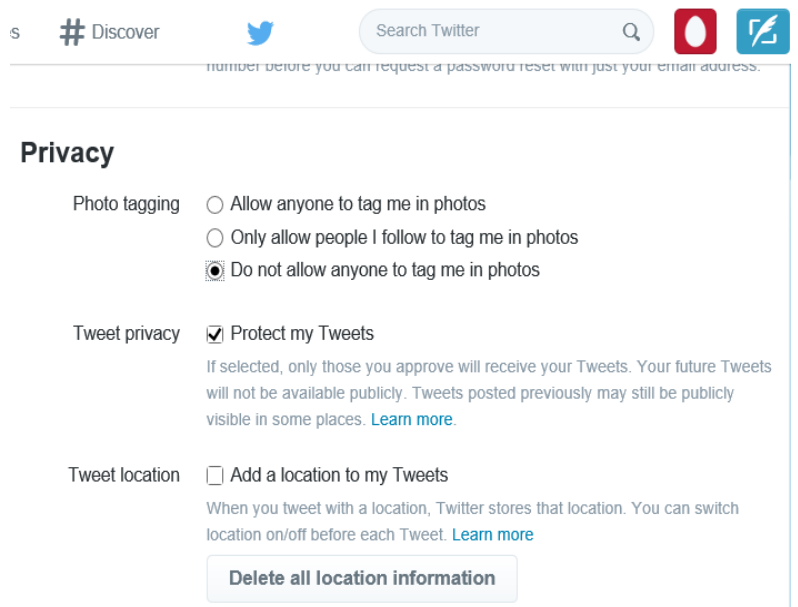
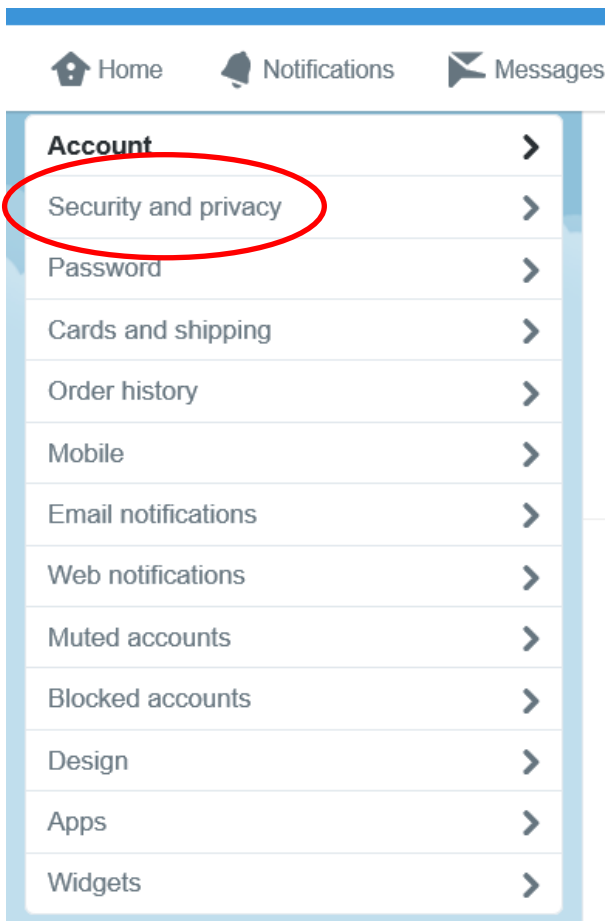
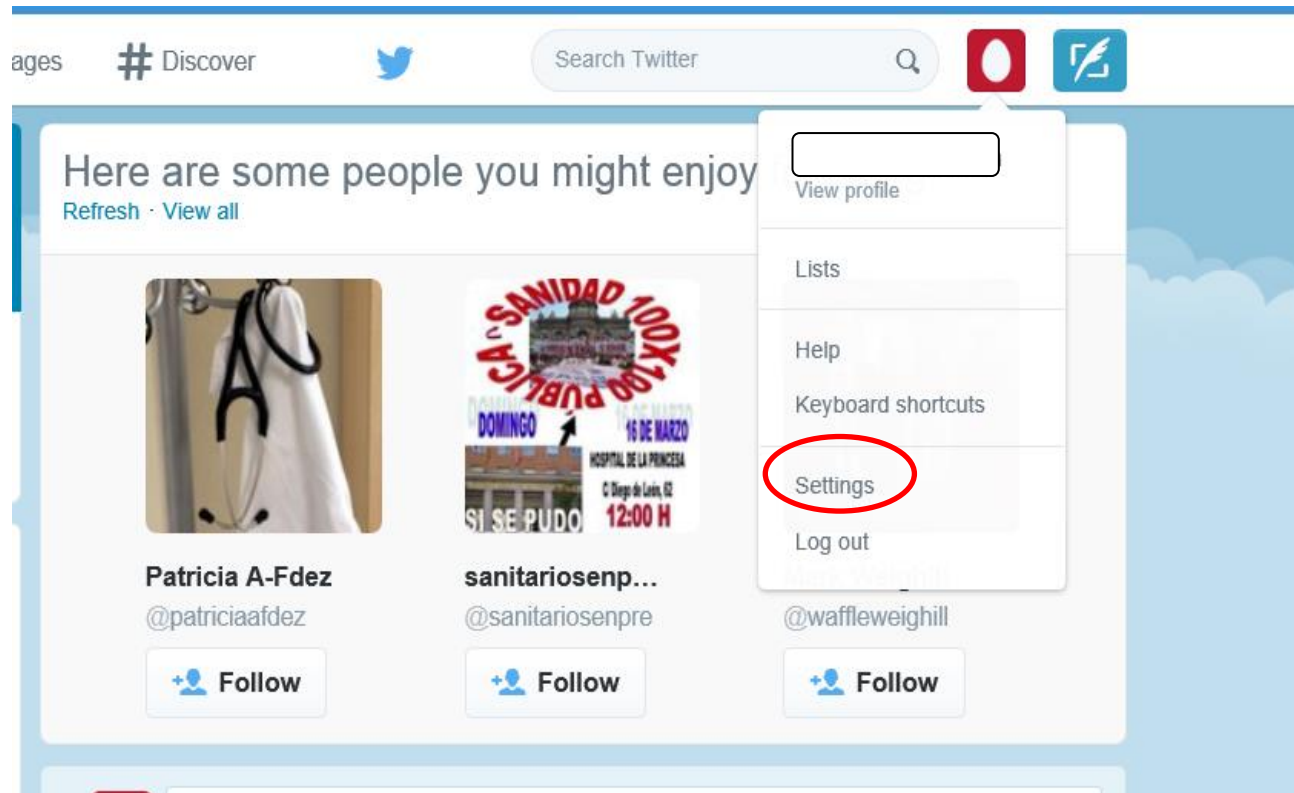
If you want to control who sees your updates, you may choose to [protect your Tweets](#). You can always change your mind and make them public later.

When you protect your Tweets, the following restrictions are put in place:

- People will have to request to follow you; each follow request will need approval. [Learn more](#).
- Your Tweets will only be visible to users you've approved.
- Other users will not be able to retweet your Tweets. [Learn more](#).
- Protected Tweets will not appear in Google search; protected Tweets will only be searchable on Twitter by the account holder and approved followers.
- @Replies you send to people who aren't following you will not be seen by those users (because you have not given them permission to see your Tweets).
- You cannot share [permanent links to your Tweets](#) with anyone other than your approved followers.

Note: [t.co](#) links, even those shared via DM, are neither protected nor public. **Anyone with the link will be able to view the content.**

iPhone/iPad

1. Go to your profile by tapping 
2. Tap **Edit Your Profile** next to your profile picture
3. Turn on the **Posts are Private** setting and then tap **Done**

Android

1. Go to your profile by tapping 
2. Tap **Edit Your Profile** next to your profile picture
3. Turn on the **Posts Are Private** setting and then tap the check mark to save your changes

Windows Phone

1. Go to your profile by tapping 
2. Tap **Edit Profile** next to your profile picture
3. Turn on the **Posts are Private** setting by checking the box and then tap the check mark to save your changes



Snapchat is an app that lets you send a photo or short video to your friends. The 'snap' appears on screen for a matter of seconds before disappearing. There's also a feature called Snapchat Story that lets you share lots of snaps in a sequence for up to 24 hours.

- it's easy to adjust privacy settings
- the default privacy settings are set so that only 'friends' can see your information.

Whatsapp is an instant messaging app, which lets you send messages, images and videos to friends. You can have one to one and group conversations.



How do I configure my Privacy Settings?

By default, WhatsApp will automatically set your Privacy Settings to allow any WhatsApp user to view your [read receipts](#), [last seen](#), [profile photo and status](#). If you don't share your last seen, you won't be able to see other people's last seen. Please note there is no way to hide your **online** status.

To change these settings, simply go to **WhatsApp** > [Menu Button](#) > **Settings** > **Account** > **Privacy**.

You can set the following options separately for last seen, profile photo, and/or status.

Everyone

Your last seen, profile photo and/or status will be available to all WhatsApp users.

My Contacts

Your last seen, profile photo and/or status will be available to your contacts from your address book only.

Nobody

Your last seen, profile photo and/or status will not be available to anyone.

If you uncheck **Read receipts**, you will not send read receipts. You will also not be able to see other's read receipts.
